What is Sugarcane?

Sugarcane is a species of tall perennial grass that is grown and cultivated for its juice, from which sugar is processed. The plant is also grown for biofuel production, especially in Brazil, as the canes can be used directly to produce ethyl alcohol. The by-products from cane sugar processing, namely the cane fibers or bagasse, can be made into pulp for paper and building products
